Word

Read aloud Exodus 20:7

1. Note the word "LORD" in 20:7. It occurs twice in the verse and both times it is in all caps, indicating that in the original Hebrew, God's name is being used: *Yahweh*. This is the name God spoke to Moses at the burning bush. God's name is *Yahweh*. It is considered so holy Jews will not speak it for fear of mispronouncing it, and therefore, breaking this third commandment. So, in most translations when *Yahweh* appears (as it does over 6,800 times in the Old Testament) "LORD" is used. What does the fact we know God's name teach us about him?
2. Were you taught the 10 Commandments as a child? If so, what did you understand this commandment to mean?
3. What are some other understandings of how this commandment is to be lived?
4. Read the verse in a couple of different translations. What do you make of the final phrase of the commandment?
5. Read Psalm 113:2-3. Notice again the word "LORD" indicating God's name is being used. How do we "bless" God's name? "Praise" his name? When we bless or praise God's name, we are keeping the third commandment.
